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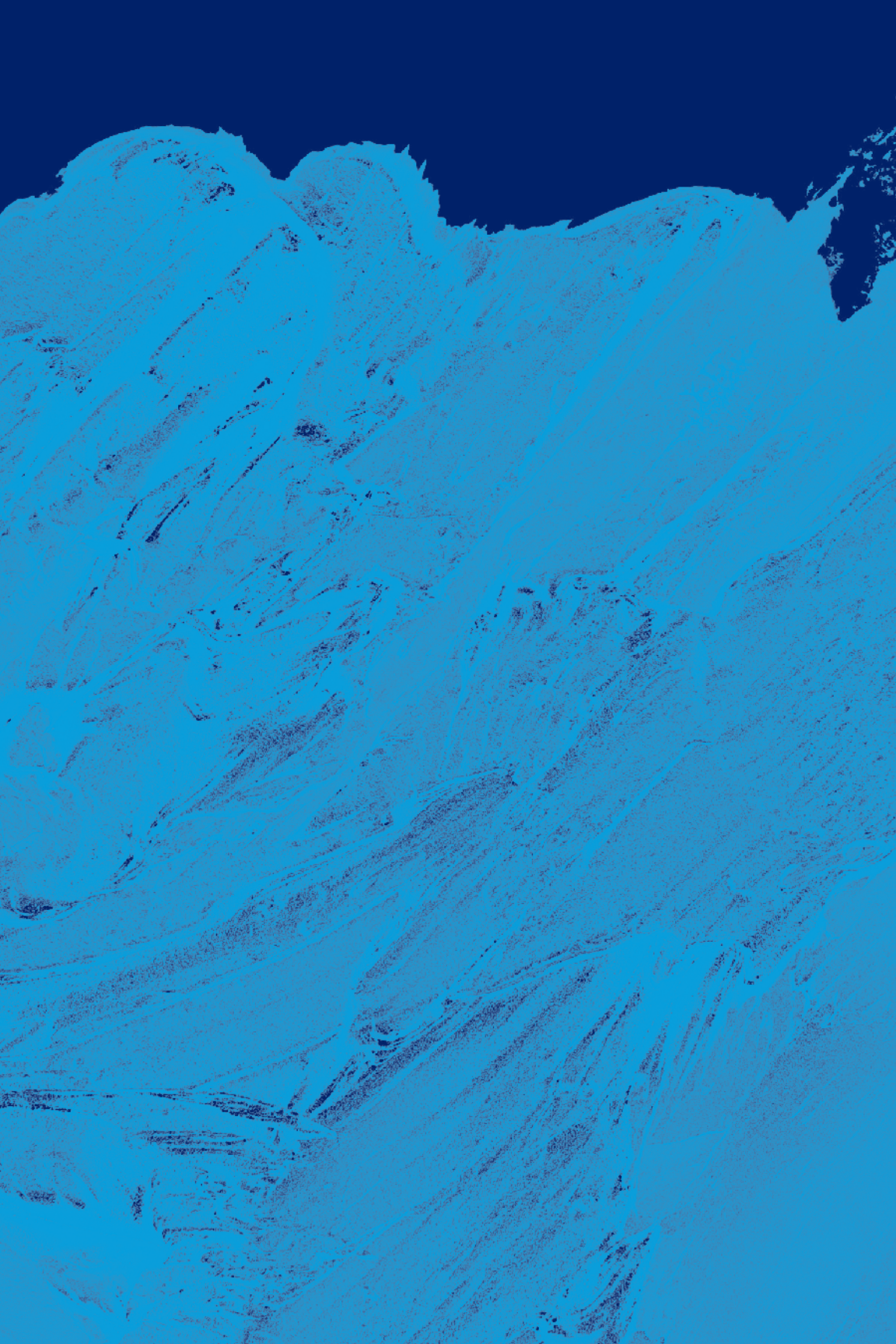

## WHAT TO EXPECT FROM A STUDIO CLASS

For some of you this will be a fairly new experience, different in many ways from other courses you have taken. What follows is a brief outline of what purpose the course serves and what policies are followed to make the course most meaning useful.

## PURPOSE AND INTENT

To introduce a variety of visual principles through projects, demonstrations, discussion of work produced and other examples. Plan on working in class on a project or a continuation of a project each time the class meets. Some projects may be one or two classes in length and some projects may be for 3 weeks. 6 hours of weekly outside class work will often be needed to complete projects on time. Fridays is a good time to do this seeing there is no class on this day.

To discuss and question the current project, in informal discussion with each other and the instructor, in groups critiques, or in a line-up of work in progress.

To become comfortable with discussing each other's work in a critical sense, we have to overcome some basic fears:

- 】 of hurting someone else's feeling by questioning his work
- 】 appearing foolish among other because of what you've said
- 】 you are doing a disservice if you do not make a contribution about what you feel are obvious weaknesses.
- 】 plan on being asked to criticize your neighbors work often

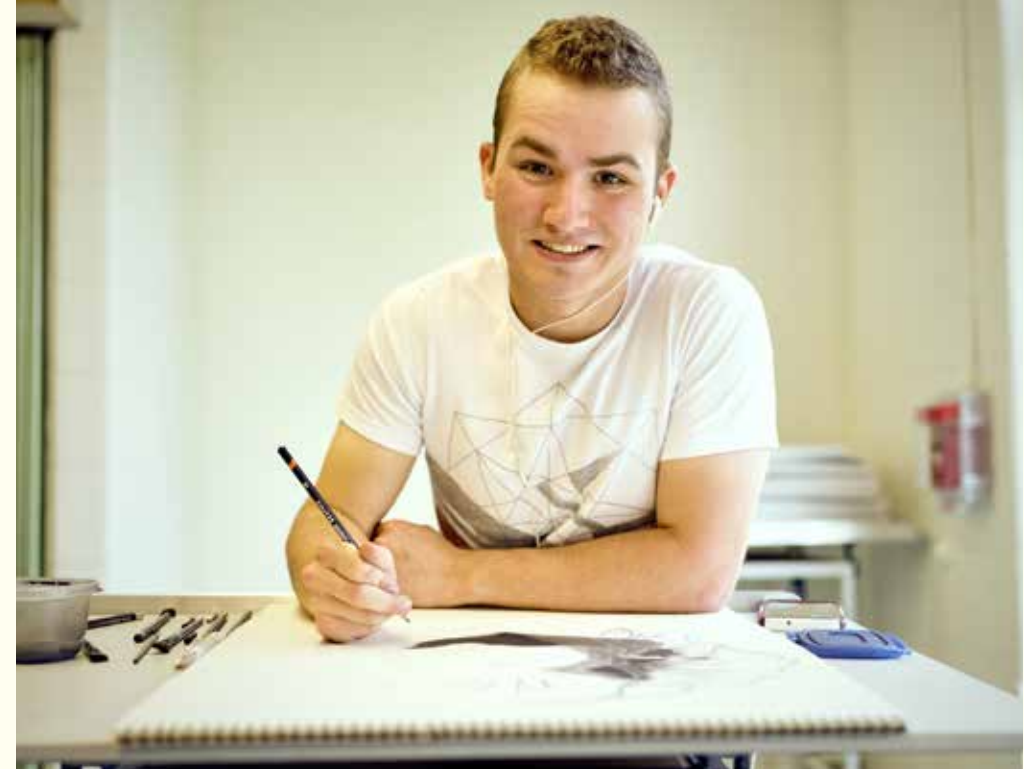

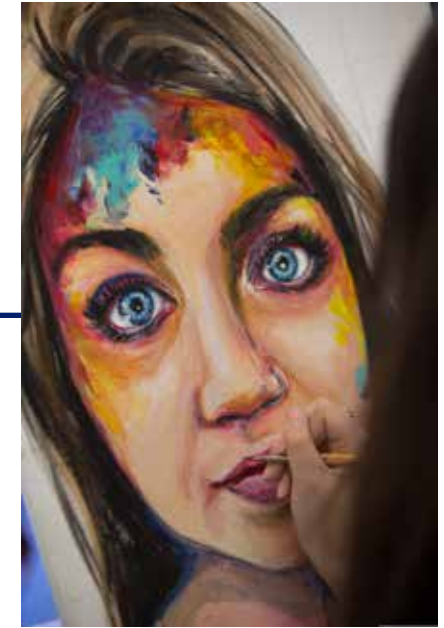
## UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC STANDING (GPA)

Academic standing for all undergraduate degree and non-degree students is based on a student's number of overall attempted credit hours and institutional GPA according to the chart below. Academic Standing is evaluated at the end of the fall and spring semesters, however, because of differences in the pattern toward the completion of degree requirements, part-time continuing education students will not be evaluated until they have attempted at least twelve credits.

24-47	2.00	1.50-1.999	Under 1.50

The grade point average is based on grade points received only from Westfield State University while the number of attempted credits is the combination of Westfield State University credits and all transfer credits that have been awarded.

Regardless of GPA, students who are making satisfactory progress and receive 3 or more F grades in a given semester will be placed on academic probation. The same standard applies to part-time continuing education students who receive 3 or more F grades in the span of attempting twelve credits.



If there is any change to the student's record (change of grade, file of repeat course paperwork, etc....) the Registrar (or continuing education Dean) will reevaluate the student's recalculated GPA in accordance with the above chart and alter their academic standing accordingly, provided the change occurs prior to the end of the add/drop period of the following semester.

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## FALL SEMESTER SOPHOMORE PORTFOLIO REVIEW

A mandatory review of a student's artwork from the Art Major. Students must pass the portfolio review to continue in the major. This in-person portfolio review by the Art Department's faculty will occur at the end of the semester during the week of finals. Students will have to submit their portfolio digitally before the Tuesday of Thanksgiving Break to review. A student who is not displaying artistic talent and academic rigor in the Art Major and does not pass this portfolio review or has below a overall 2.0 GPA (required Sophomore Level University GPA) will be asked to drop the major. A student can reapply to become an Art Major after re-obtaining a overall 2.0 GPA and resubmitting a portfolio for review by the department and the department accepting the portfolio.

*\*The department's acceptance of the 60-credit transfer (junior standing) student's portfolio submission upon entering the University will meet the requirement of this class.*

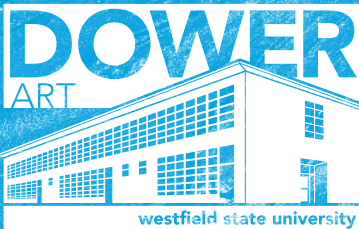
